



2019 CIP Centenary Student Award

The Award

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of the Canadian Institute of Planners, a one-time award will be granted to a student or group of students where at least one member is enrolled in a Canadian accredited planning program.

Description

The **2019 CIP Centenary Student Award** will be awarded for the most outstanding multi-media (e.g., mixed media, film, animation, song, etc.) submission, as determined by a jury. The project submitted should highlight the historical significance of planning and examine the future contribution to Canadian society.

Planning-related multidisciplinary groups or teams with diverse skills in media and communications are encouraged to submit an entry. This could include interdisciplinary collaboration, as well as inter-institutional groups/teams (i.e. media & communication, architecture, landscape architecture, GIS, engineering, etc.).

Amount

The final amount will be determined by the amount raised through donations; however, the minimum award amount has been set at **\$5,000**. All prize money must be shared equally between members of the team.

Eligibility

To qualify for this award:

- The primary applicant of the group must be a CIP student member enrolled full-time accredited Canadian planning program at the time that the entry is submitted to the jury. MCIP and provisional members who have returned to school are not eligible for the scholarship.
- If this is a team submission, individuals must also be enrolled (full-time or part-time) in a post-secondary program.
- All submissions must be original and associated materials and images must be original and/or compliant with common law and/or statutory copyright.
- Submissions must be received by the CIP National Office by March 29, 2019.

Criteria

The submission will be judged on the basis of its potential contribution and/or recognition of the history, lessons learned, or the place of the planning profession in Canada and the role that planning will play in the future.

Submissions must be a minimum of 2 minutes and maximum of 5 minutes in length.

The jury will consider the following:

- A 200-word biography from an individual or in the case of a group submission, a 500-word biography of the group outlining their studies, as well as their personal interests.
- A 500-word description of the project.
- The historical relevance or significance of the topic in furthering the understanding of the role, influence and/or lessons learned of planning in Canada over the past 100 years, and the contribution that planning will provide in the future of Canadian society.
- The creativity of the proposed multimedia approach to the topic.
- The level of university study.
- A completed application form, which includes the names and contact information of all members of the submission team.

Award Announcement/Presentation: 2019 CIP Centenary Conference

The CIP Centenary Student Award will be presented at the 2019 CIP annual conference in Ottawa, July 3-6, 2019, which marks the 100th anniversary of CIP.

The award-winner (or a representative of the award-winning group) will be invited to come to Ottawa to accept the award and present their project. Additional travel funding to attend the conference will be available for one representative.

CIP will publish details on the award-winning submission in *Plan Canada* magazine and share on social media. Submissions not selected as the winner, may also be posted to social media and shared with members and the public.
