



Ted Fobert & Robert Tennant Planning Merit Bursary

Description

The Ted Fobert & Robert Tennant Planning Merit Bursary is awarded to a graduate student who demonstrates interest and intent to further innovative approaches to community building and municipal planning.

Amount

\$3,000.00

Eligibility

To qualify for this bursary, the applicant must be:

- A CIP student member in good standing for the current academic year. MCIP and provisional members who have returned to school are not eligible for the bursary.
- A graduate student enrolled full-time in an accredited Canadian planning program during the term of the award of the bursary.
- In need of financial assistance to support their education, as evidenced by government student loans documents or equivalent justification.

Criteria

The submission will be judged on the basis of its potential contribution to the planning profession (in theory or practice), or its potential service to a community or community group. In their deliberations, the jury will consider the following documents:

- A 500-word biography from the applicant outlining their studies, as well as their personal interests.
- A current resume demonstrating the applicant's past and present commitments to their community.

- A completed application form.
- Government student loans documents or equivalent records.

Indigenous peoples are asked to self-identify and will be provided preferential review.

Jury

The jury will verify that the eligibility criteria have been met. Their decision is final.
