In recent years, CIP has been focusing its work on five key policy priorities: Equity, Diversity, & Inclusion (EDI), Truth & Reconciliation, Climate Change, Healthy Communities, and Housing. As a result, CIP has developed the *Equity, Diversity and Inclusion\_Roadmap* and three national policies to guide planners' work on *Climate Change Planning, Healthy Communities*, and *Planning Practice and Reconciliation*. These priorities are also reflected in our brand-new Strategic Plan: 1,835 Days of Impact. With this plan, CIP reaffirms its support of inclusive and vibrant communities, respectfully connected to the natural world, for the well-being of current and future generations.

#### **VOLUNTEERING & NETWORKING**

As a member of CIP, you have access to *volunteer opportunities* to get involved in national committees and juries, as well as to represent CIP on external projects and organizations. CIP also has two LinkedIn groups that members may join — *general* and *international* planning — that provide additional networking, volunteering, and learning opportunities.

All members are welcome to attend CIP's Annual General Meeting, normally held at the national planning conference.

This centralized site includes recorded webinar and conference presentations, resources, and documents. Organized by subject, it is ideal for accessing free Continuous Professional Learning (CPL) content and sourcing best practices in planning from across the country.
